Reading and Literacy

(Right to Read Initiatives)

- 364 0-3 year olds attended story-time events
- 297 4-11 year olds took part in Summer Stars
- 228 children attended Young Readers Festival events



Creativity, S.T.E A.M. and Self-Realisation

- 267 children aged 5 to 12 took part in craft workshops
- Monthly creative writing workshops for teens
- 439 children took part in outreach workshops in the areas of science,technology and engineering





Culture, Community and Business Advice

- 623 patrons between the ages of 20 and 60 attended book clubs and film clubs
- 1132 adults attended all types of groups from Irish language to Ukulele
- 84 attended one-to-one Business advice sessions with the Local Enterprise Office as part of Work Matters
- 60 attended Older Wiser Laughter events such as mindfulness, painting and willow weaving
- Fitness advice for ages 60+ occurred regularly
